

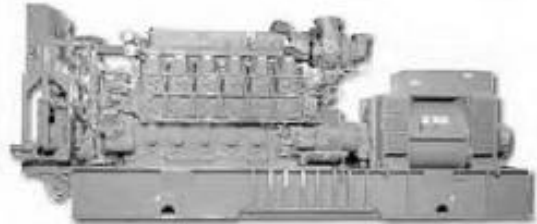

Distributed Generation: *What's New, and How to Make It Happen*

Changes to environmental regulations and the energy marketplace are impacting if and how energy users in the New York City area may take advantage of distributed generation (DG). Emergency rules set up for the summer of 2001 have run out, a committee set up by Gov. Pataki has been working to remove roadblocks to customer-owned generation, and DG technologies have advanced. Our speakers will describe the rules and permits that apply, available financial incentives (for both studies and installations), and some of the commercial services and equipment to support deployment. Both fuel and utility steam-powered generators will be reviewed, along with case studies of systems being installed in our area.
