Many large facilities buying power through fixed or collared pricing contracts might save money under real time pricing (RTP) options available from Con Ed, power marketers, or via direct access purchasing from the NY ISO. While some cash flow risk exists, annual electric bills may be lowered. RTP may also enhance savings of some energy options (e.g., automated dimming) while reducing the value of others.

Explore Con Ed's Voluntary RTP option (Rider M), hear experience with buying directly from the ISO, and review the software, hardware, and funding available to make it all happen.
